**We are Committed to the Affordability
of a JEC Education for All of Our Families.**

This innovative program ensures that tuition will never exceed a reasonable percentage of family income. With a respectful and simple enrollment process, tuition, regardless of how many children are enrolled, will be capped at a percentage of Adjusted Gross Income (AGI), as determined by line 11 of your IRS tax return.

JEC AFFORDABILITY AT A GLANCE

AGI RANGE	TUITION CAP <i>(as a percentage of AGI)</i>
\$150 K - \$174 K	15%
\$175 K - \$199 K	16%
\$200 K - \$224 K	17%
\$225 K - \$250 K	18%

Applying for the JEC Middle Income Affordability Program is Easy!

- Please visit our website at TheJEC.org/TuitionMAX and fill out the FACTS application.
- If you have a child/children enrolled in another Jewish school (K-12), a \$5,000 credit will be applied per child to your AGI. For example, if your AGI is \$180,000 and you have two children in a Jewish day school other than the JEC, your eligibility for program benefits will be evaluated as if your AGI were \$170,000!

Eligibility Exceptions Include: *

1. A family net worth over \$1 million (*net worth includes home equity and retirement accounts*).
2. Filing of Schedules C and E as part of your federal tax return.
3. Reduction of a JEC family's current year's tuition by more than \$5,000.
4. Non-dual income families where there are no children kindergarten-age or younger.
5. Tuition Max reduction can not exceed 50% of tuition costs.

NOTE: The tax-deductible family obligations are not included in this program.
* Families who do not qualify for enrollment may still be eligible for a financial scholarship. The Scholarship Committee will review applications on a case-by-case basis. Supporting documentation may be requested.
